## A Sanctified Perspective

"Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:2)

Well, the Old Year has been ushered out and a New Year has began. It seems so fast that the old year was experienced. What is your perspective on the upcoming New Year? Mine is <u>anticipation</u> (mental attitude that influences a later response). My approach is that, my attitude determines my outcome. I am convinced that I'm on a journey that was predestined for me. I was created for such a time as this to fulfill what I was designed to do. Everyday is exciting because everyday yields revelation in what I'm destined to do. "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10).

This New Year is destined to become what each one of us chooses it to be. It is the Heavenly Fathers heart that we be conformed to the "image of His Son" (Rom. 8:29). Many strive to become something they were not destined to become. He has created us to represent Him as Kingdom sons & daughters in excellence & glory. Romans 9:23 "and that He might make known the riches of His glory on the vessels of mercy, which He had prepared beforehand for glory". We are on a prophetic time clock that is drawing us closer to the catching away of the Church. We have to be in position to hear the voice of Heaven calling us up to the marriage supper of the Lamb (Rev. 19:9). If we are distracted by the world and its cares we could miss the coming of the Bridegroom (Matt. 25:1-13).

We have to reach a place in our lives where we do not participate in the deeds of the flesh. The Apostle Paul addresses the Church about temptation and allowing sin to dominate their lives. "And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Therefore let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light. Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts" (Romans 13:11-14). He is saying that the time left before the Lord's return is growing short and we must be even more in love with God and sensitivity to the Holy Spirit.

This is the same reasoning that the Lord Jesus used in the parables of the ten virgins and of the stewards and their talents (Mt. 25). The message of these four verses (vv. 11-14) can be summed up in the words of Jesus from Luke 21:34, "But take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and cares of this life, and that Day come on you unexpectedly". The issue of the Lord's imminent return adds even more importance to us walking in love. Paul is using the term "flesh," as referring to the part of man that has not been changed by Christ, (our sinful appetites and desires, Rom. 7:18). These sinful lusts cannot dominate us if we don't make provision for them. Paul is saying to cut off the flesh's rations and starve it to death. Many Christians have mistakenly believed that during our life here on the earth, we are destined to have ungodly lusts and desires. But it doesn't have to be that way. The sin nature that enslaved our flesh is gone, and to the degree that we renew our minds through God's Word, we can experience victory over the flesh (Ro m. 5:21).

The reason the flesh seems so strong in many people's lives is because they are continually feeding it. Temptation is linked to what we think on. In 1Thessalonians 5:23, Paul writes that spirit, soul and body need to be sanctified (set apart for holiness). Sanctification is made possible by the Grace of God, which empowers us to live a life of holiness, where spirit, soul and body are used as instruments of God. "And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God" (Romans 6:13). This year many New Years resolutions will be made. People will try to loose weight, exercise, save money, give more, love more and etc...All is good, and written in the Word of God that we should apply these things in our life. But what profit is it, if it is not motivated from a heart of love for the Lord?

Read what Solomon concluded by Divine perspective...."I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and indeed, all is vanity and grasping for the wind" (Ecclesiastes 1:14). We should have a perspective also about priorities in life. What is your number one priority for this New Year? I have mine. It is to be more in love with God so I can love others and to be in fellowship with the Holy Spirit. He is the Divine Agent sent from Heaven to reveal destiny for our lives. Debbie & I have had many conversations about life as husband and wife. The Spirit of God who is Big in us is revealing that time is drawing us closer to the meeting of the Lord in the air (1Thess.4:17). We admonish all of you "seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God" (Colossians 3:1).

## <u> A Senior Student Testifies</u>

Hi, my name is Brian Nayman. I grew up in Pennsylvania, but moved to S. Pines North Carolina in 1986. I am 53 years old. I have been married 27 years. I have 5 children and 4 Grandchildren. I grew up attending a Presbyterian Church where I heard about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but nothing about salvation. In 1971 I started smoking pot, taking drugs, and drinking. It was not until 1977, at age 21 that I heard the salvation message. At that time, alone on my knees in my bedroom I accepted Jesus as my Savior. Not being in Church or knowing what to do next, not much changed. I married my wife Terri in 1982, and as we began a family we started to attend Charismatic Community Church in Cols. Ohio. We moved to S. Pines, North Carolina in 1986 and started attending an Assembly of God Church. It was there that God really began to work in our lives and I allowed Him to be Lord of my life. It was in 1987-1988 that God delivered me from drugs, alcohol, and cigarettes. We began studying Kenneth Hagin materials and I got actively involved with the Christian Men's Network – Dr. Edwin L. Cole. Life was wonderful. My wife and I attended Rhema Bible training center in 1994 and returned to N.C. after graduation in 1996. I

knew that God had me in preparation time for serving Him; after all if Jesus had thirty years of preparation time, I knew that 2 years of Bible College would not be enough for me. My wife and I actively served in Church while raising our family. In 2002 I began to take prescription pain medication for lower back problems. I remember that God spoke to me and said "Don't do that." But I rationalized that taking one pill in the mornings would not hurt me. After about a year of that my body became addicted to the drugs and then I battled withdrawal symptoms of anxiety and depression. As the pain increased, the pills increased and soon my spirit was no longer in control of my body and soul (mind, will and emotions) I still read my Bible and prayed but my faith and self esteem were clouded with guilt and shame. I cried out desperately and God assured me that He still loved me and would not leave me nor forsake me. In April of 2008 I had an eight hour surgery done on my back, but that meant more pills during recovery and then the withdrawal. Guilt and shame still plagued me for what I had done to myself and my family. I could not fix this myself. I sought help. Because of Pastor Rocky and Debbie's obedience to God's call on their life, my spirit has been renewed,



my family restored and my preparation time is continuing. They have truly created an atmosphere for God to work here at Shiloh. I am so grateful to have my life back again, Spirit Controlled. Thank you Shiloh Supporters for keeping the doors open, "for you may be confident of this very thing, that He which hath begun a good work in us will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6)
