Social In-ept'ness

"Behold, I will bring health and healing; I will heal them and reveal to them the abundance of peace and truth" (Jeremiah 33:6)

Everyday that I live on planet Earth, I try to observe life with a Heavenly perspective. When I have this perspective, then life becomes purposeful. We live in a world that pressures us into competitiveness, where we are self-absorbed to be the best. It is a world that the bibles says, "lies under the sway of the wicked one", ( 1 John 5:19). The truth that He gave her at the well was symbolic of dryness of her soul. She needed to drink from a Heavenly well that would spring up in her to encounter the Lord. It is a heart of gratitude that expresses a yearning for others to encounter God likewise. It is in this place where we are confident of bringing Heaven to Earth (Matt.6:10) for others to benefit. E.M. Bounds has written many books on prayer. He was able to teach & write effectively on prayer because he lived it & experienced it. One of his quotes from his many books on prayer says; "Prayer must be broad in its scope—it must plead for others. Intercession for others is the hall-mark of all true prayer. When prayer is confined to self and to the sphere of one's personal needs, it dies by reason of its littleness, narrowness and selfishness. Prayer must be broad and unselfish or it will perish. Prayer is the soul of a man stirred to plead with God for men. In addition to being interested in the eternal interests of one's own soul it must, in its very nature, be concerned for the spiritual and eternal welfare of others. One's ability to pray for self, finds its climax in the compassion its concern expresses for other's."

This praying for others finds it's fervency in knowing God & receiving His Heart for dying humanity. I do not believe that God expects less from us than from others who have entered into their prayer closets & changed the course of Divine judgment. We cannot sit passively by & let others pray while we sit on the side lines of life & have a prayer-less life. 
